Description

Students establish foundational interpretation skills of the Tarot, to deliver precise readings to individuals on subjects including health, money, business and love. Developing their psychic skills, students engage techniques that promote personal growth and professional development. The history of Tarot and Psychic Development are studied to support students in building a broad understanding of this tool for spiritual development, life coaching and counseling. Students investigate traditions of symbology to enhance their understanding of the Tarot.

Course Descriptions

TPDP1000	Tarot and Psychic Development	24 hours

Students will be introduced to the Ancient Art of Reading the Tarot. Students discover psychic development techniques and allegorical languages of pictures and symbols (semiotics, iconography, symbolism, and symbolic systems). The history of Tarot is examined, through the mysteries of both its' creation and use, with an emphasis on the Rider-Waite Tarot, the hermetic tradition, Astrology and the Tree of Life. Students identify the components that assemble the modern Tarot and discuss variants of the Tarot's structure.

TPDP1001	Intro to the Major Arcana 1	40 hours

Students investigate the structure of the Major Arcana of the Tarot. Students describe the journey of the hero to identify the story of the archetypes presented in each card. Applying the Tarot to the Tree of Life, students identify associations and basic interpretations of each card. Students learn about the first 8 cards of the Major Arcana.

TPDP1002 Intro to the Major Arcana 2 35 hours

Students investigate the structure of the Major Arcana of the Tarot. Students describe the journey of the hero to identify the story of the archetypes presented in each card. Applying the Tarot to the Tree of Life, students identify associations and basic interpretations of each card. Students learn about the cards 8 to 14 of the Major Arcana.

TPDP1003 Intro to the Major Arcana 3 35 hours

Students investigate the structure of the Major Arcana of the Tarot. Students describe the journey of the hero to identify the story of the archetypes presented in each card. Applying the Tarot to the Tree of Life, students identify associations and basic interpretations of each card. Students learn about the cards 15 to 21 of the Major Arcana.

TPDP1004 Intro to the Minor Arcana 40 hours

Students investigate the structure of the Minor Arcana of the Tarot. Students describe the suits of the deck and apply historical, cultural, and elemental associations. Applying the Tarot to the Tree of Life and numerology, students identify foundational interpretations of each card. Students learn the rudiments of cards 1 to 10 in each Minor Arcana suit.

TPDP1005 Intro to the Court Cards 16 hours

Students investigate the structure of the Court Cards of the Minor Arcana. Students differentiate the individuals represented in the cards by suit, element, culture and personality. Applying the Tarot to the Tree of Life and numerology, students identify foundational interpretations of each court card. Observing how the court cards can represent people, places, things, and events, students determine effective approaches to recognize each card's proper application.

TPDP1006 Reading the Tarot 1 20 hours

Students employ techniques, including card interpretations, storytelling and identifying appropriate reading styles and spreads, to create effective and appropriate Tarot readings. Experimenting with card combinations, students discover how to predict accurate storylines.

TPDP1007 Year 1 Retreat (September) 16 hours

Students facilitate Tarot readings, through role-playing and client service, to enhance their knowledge of storytelling. Investigating esoteric tools for further interpretation of Tarot, students distinguish when and how to apply specific meanings to each card. Students analyze other psychic development traditions
